

FROG Gives Back To The Community! Plant Sale \$\$ to Organic Gardening Grants

FROG awarded 13 grants, totaling \$5,770, to projects that teach organic gardening using hands-on methods and serve vulnerable populations.

Charles Hay World School: 350 K-6th grade students

- \$300 for mobile “grow center” construction

DCIS at Fairmont School Garden: 420 inner-city elementary school students

- \$700 for garden repairs, “three sisters” garden, tools

DCIS MS & HS at Baker Int’l School Garden: 308 inner-city HS students, 47 in garden club

- \$630 for pollinator garden with international signage, shade structure, garden journals, gloves

Dora Moore Elementary School Garden Club: 50 inner-city kindergarten students

- \$570 for kindergarten “grow and sow” project

EarthLinks: homeless and impoverished individuals

- \$500 for continuous work on year-round gardens and workshops

Eating Disorder Foundation: people with eating disorders, friends/families

- \$473 for continuous work on therapeutic garden, ornamental and food-producing

Fulton Academy of Excellence: 40-200 underprivileged elementary school students

- \$200 for experimental garden to show benefits of organic gardening

Jovial Concepts: low-income residents of Barnum neighborhood

- \$250 for converting yards to new organic gardens, take remainder plants at our Sale

Montessori Children’s House of Denver School Garden: 200+ infant to 9th grade students

- \$700 for reviving educational organic garden, introduce vermiculture

Sanctuary Garden (DUG): 100 refugees and their children, local seniors

- \$697 for continuous work on organic garden beds, irrigation, wood chipper

Sprout City Farms: Thousands of Denver metro residents

- \$500 for educational bilingual signage in organic food & pollinator gardens

Sweet Soil Community Garden: 300+ culturally diverse community families

- \$250 to help establish new organic gardens – compost bins, wheelbarrows, tools, hoses
